Similar to Natural Reader, Read Aloud can read various file formats including PDFs on PC, web pages, Word documents, Epub, TXT, DOCX, and more. On Windows 10 with Edge browser, users can share files directly with the app, and it offers standard voice settings like volume control, speed rate, pitch rate, fonts, color scheme, etc. Another free software, Power Text to Speech Reader, provides an option to convert PDFs to audio files, which is not available in Read Aloud. It also supports email formats (EML) and RTF along with HTML and Doc. This feature allows users to listen to long emails instead of just reading attachments. The software works on Windows 7/8 machines and has a handy plugin for Internet Explorer compatibility. Balabolka, another free Text-To-Speech program, converts and saves PDF files into audio formats like MP3, MP4, OGG, and WMA. It supports a maximum number of file formats, including AZW, XLS, XLSX, CHM, DjVu, DOC, DOCX, EML, EPUB, FB2, HTML, etc. A portable version is available for users who need to carry the software on different computers. A Chrome Extension called Read Aloud allows users to listen to PDF files on the web without downloading them. It offers a user-friendly interface with options like language, voice, speed, pitch, and volume control. Users can pause or stop the audio playback at any time. Although not suitable for local PDF files, it can be used by dragging and dropping files into the Chrome browser and clicking on the extension. Read Aloud for Windows and TTSReader are viable alternatives to traditional software options. For those who prefer not to install any third-party apps, Microsoft Edge's built-in PDF Voice Reader is an ideal choice. For more power users, Adobe Acrobat Reader offers a range of features including the ability to read out loud for different file formats like PDF, DOC, HTML, etc. Balabolka provides a lot of functionality for free and Natural Reader serves commercial versions well if budget allows.
